This Tariff contains regulations and rates applicable for the furnishing of General Exchange Service and for other General Subscriber Services, equipment and facilities associated with the preceding services offered by Oakman Telephone Company, d/b/a TDS TELECOM and regulated by the Alabama Public Service Commission. This Tariff is on file with the Alabama Public Service Commission.

Intrastate Communications Services are furnished through facilities provided by the company for the transmission of intelligence by electrical impulse, principally by means of wire, radio, or a combination thereof.

EXPLANATION OF SYMBOLS

When changes are made in any Tariff page, a revised page will be issued canceling the Tariff page affected. Such changes will be identified through the use of the following symbols:

- [C] To signify changed regulation
- [D] To signify discontinued rate, regulation or text
- [I] To signify increase
- [L] To signify a relocation of material with no changes
- [M] To signify a move from one page to another with no change to text, regulation, or Tariff
- [N] To signify a new rate, regulation or text
- [O] To signify a rate regulation text transferred to obsolete Tariff section
- [R] To signify a reduction
- [S] To signify matter already appearing in another part of Tariff and repeated for clarification
- [T] To signify a change in text but no change in rate or regulation.

The above symbols will apply except where additional symbols are identified at the bottom of an individual page or at the beginning or end of a section or paragraph.
