DEFINITIONS

ACCESS LINE (N)

A circuit between a switching center and a subscriber premises which includes a network interface device.

ACCESSORIES (T)

Devices which are mechanically attached to, or used with, the facilities and equipment furnished by the Telephone Company and which are independent of, and not electrically, acoustically or inductively connected to, the communications path of the telecommunications system. These devices may not replace any of the component parts of the Company facilities or equipment nor be injurious to the telecommunications network.

ADDITIONAL LISTINGS (D)
(C)

Any listing of a name or other authorized information in connection with a customer's telephone number in addition to that which is entitled in connection with regular telephone service.

AIR LINE MILEAGE

The shortest distance between the points involved.

APPLICANT (T)

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, municipality, cooperative, organization, governmental agency, etc. applying to the Company for new service or reconnection of discontinued service.

APPLICATION (N)

A request made verbally or in writing for telephone service and including a request for a change in existing service.

AUTHORIZED USER (N)(D)
(K)

A person, firm or corporation (other than the customer) on whose premise a telephone, Private Branch Exchange, or Private Line Service or Channel is located and who may communicate over such channels in accordance with the terms of this tariff.

AUTOMATIC ANNOUNCING AND RECORDING DEVICE (T)(M)

Any automatic terminal equipment which automatically answers incoming calls with a recorded announcement.

BATTERY POWER (N)

Direct current electrical energy furnished on the customer's premise.

BUILDING (N)

The term "same building" or "building" is to be interpreted to mean a structure under one roof or two or more structures which are connected by an enclosed passageway in which the wires or cables of the Telephone

Company may be placed without exposure to outside electrical circuits or the weather. In no case can pipes and conduit be considered as an enclosed passageway. (K)

BUSINESS SERVICE

(T)(K)

Business service is exchange service furnished to customers whose actual or obvious use of the service is for conducting a business, trade, or profession or whose use of the service is obviously not confined to domestic use. Use of a telephone number on business cards, billboard and vehicle signs, or in newspaper and magazine advertising in conjunction with the continuing provision of goods or services, shall constitute business service.

CCSA

(N)

Common Control Switching Arrangements (CCSA) are switching arrangements provided on Telephone Company premises to interconnect channels for 1) private line telephone service, and 2) alternate private line telephone-data service.

CENTRAL OFFICE

A switching unit in a system which provides telecommunications service to the general public, having the necessary equipment and operating arrangements for terminating and interconnecting subscriber lines and trunks.

CENTRAL OFFICE CONNECTING FACILITY

(N)

A facility furnished to another common carrier by the Telephone Company between the terminal location of the other common carrier and a point of connection on the telephone company premises for intra or interstate use.

CENTRAL OFFICE LINE - See "Exchange Access Line"

(N)

CLASS OF SERVICE

(M)

The various categories of service generally available to the subscriber: residence and business.

CHANNEL

(K)

A path for communication or signaling between two or more stations or company offices furnished in such a manner as the company may elect, whether by wire, radio or a combination thereof.

CIRCUIT

(N)

A channel used for the transmission of electrical energy in the furnishing of telephone and other communication services.

COIN BOX TELEPHONE SERVICE

(T)

A telephone station set, either public or semi-public, equipped with a device for collecting money in payment of telephone message and used in connection with either public or semi-public telephone service.

COLLECT CALL

(N)

The procedure by which certain messages, upon request, may be reversed (charged to the called station) upon acceptance of the call at the called station.

COMMISSION

(T)

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission

COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS

(N)(K)

Denotes channel or other facilities and equipment which are capable, when not connected to long distance message telecommunications service, of 2-way communications between customer provided terminal equipment or Telephone Company access lines.

The term "Communications Systems" when used in connection with communications systems provided by an Other Common Carrier (OCC), denotes channel and other facilities furnished by the OCC for private line services as such OCC is authorized by the Federal Communications Commission or Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission to provide.

COMPANY

(T)(M)

A corporation, association, partnership or individual engaged in the business of furnishing telephone and other telecommunication services to the public, under the jurisdiction of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission. Whenever used in this tariff "Company" refers to the McDaniel Telephone Company unless

the context clearly indicates otherwise.

COMPLETE DISCONNECT

(N)(D)

A discontinuance of service where a customer cannot receive incoming calls or place outgoing calls.

CONNECTING ARRANGEMENT

(T)(M)

(D)

The equipment provided by the Company to accomplish the direct electrical connection of customer-provided facilities with the facilities of the Company or of facilities of the Company with other facilities of the Company.

CONNECTING COMPANY (N)(K)

A corporation, association, partnership or individual owning or operating a toll line and/or one or more central offices providing local exchange telephone service to the public and with whom the Company interchanges traffic.

CONNECTION (N)

The term "Connection" denotes the establishment of telephone service. A move of existing service to a different premises requires a "connection"

CONNECTION CHARGE (T)

See "Service Connection Charge"

CONSTRUCTION CHARGE (N)

A separate non-recurring charge made for the construction of facilities in excess of those contemplated under the rates quoted in Sheet No. 39.

CONTIGUOUS EXCHANGES

Two exchanges whose boundaries adjoin.

CONTINUOUS PROPERTY (T)

The plot of ground, together with any building thereon, occupied by the customer, which is not divided by public highways or separated by property occupied by others.

CONTRACT (T)(M)

The agreement between a customer and the Company under which service and/or facilities are furnished in accordance with the applicable provisions of the tariff.

COST (N)(K)

The cost of labor and materials, which includes appropriate amounts to cover the Company's general operating and administrative expenses, and return requirement. (D)

CUSTOMER (T)(K)

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, municipality, cooperative organization, governmental agency, etc. supplied with service by the Company.

CUSTOMER-PROVIDED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT (CPE) (T)

Devices or apparatus and their associated wiring, provided by a customer, which do not constitute a communications system and which, when connected to the communications paths of the telephone system, are so connected either electrically, acoustically or inductively.

DATA ACCESS ARRANGEMENT (T)

A protective connecting arrangement for use with the network control signaling unit, or in lieu of the connecting arrangement, an arrangement to identify a central office line and protective facilities and procedures to assure proper operation and protection of the telecommunications network.

DATE OF PRESENTATION (T)

The date upon which a bill or notice is mailed first class postage prepaid to the customer or if not mailed, the date upon which that bill or notice is presented to the customer by a representative of the Company. (M)

DEPOSIT (N) (K)

A cash payment made by the customer in aid of establishing or reestablishing credit with the Company. Such payment, or alternative to such payment, which may be required before or during the period of service offsets the risk that the customer may make inadequate payment following a period of service. Interest is payable on all deposited amounts.

DIAL SWITCHING EQUIPMENT (N) (D)

A unit of electro-mechanical or electronic switching equipment used in a central office or in connection with a Private Branch Exchange System.

DIRECT ELECTRICAL CONNECTION (T)

Connection of terminal equipment to the telephone network by means other than acoustic and/or inductive coupling i.e., connected by electrically conductive metallic paths.

DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE (N)

A service provided to assist customers in obtaining telephone numbers which are, or are not listed in the directory.

DIRECTORY LISTING (T)

A publication in the Company's alphabetical directory of information relative to a customer's name or other identification and telephone number.

DISCONNECT NOTICE (N) (M)

The written notice sent to a customer following billing, notifying him that his service will be discontinued if charges are not satisfied by the date specified on the notice.

DROP WIRE

(N)

(K)

That portion of a circuit between the pole line or cable distributing box and the building in which the station or switchboard is located.

END USE COMMON LINE (EUCL)

(D)

(N)(D)

Denotes a line, trunk or other facility provided to a subscriber under the general and/or local exchange service tariffs of the Company, terminated in a central office switch and which may be used to make and receive exchange service calls, intrastate message service calls or interstate message service calls no matter if the subscriber causes the line, trunk or facility to be arranged to prohibit any type of calls to be made or received.

ENTRANCE FACILITIES

(N)

Facilities extending from the point of entrance on private property to the premises on which service is furnished.

EXCHANGE

(T)

A unit established by the Company for communication service in a specific geographic area, which unit usually embraces a city, town, village or unincorporated community and environs. It may consist of one or more central offices, together with the associated plant used in furnishing communication service to the general public within that area.

EXCHANGE ACCESS LINE

(M)

Central office line equipment and all outside plant facilities needed to connect the central office with the customer premises and provides access to and from the network for toll and local exchange calling appropriate to the tariffed use offering selected by the customer.

EXCHANGE AREA

(K)

An area within which the Utility holds itself out to render exchange telephone service from the central office or offices service that area in accordance with the provisions of the tariff.

EXCHANGE SERVICE

See "Local Service"

EXTENDED AREA SERVICE

(T)

Interexchange telephone service to other specified exchanges furnished at a flat rate.

FACILITIES

(T)

Cables, poles, wires and other materials and mechanisms necessary to or furnished in connection with telephone service.

FLAT RATE SERVICE

(T)

Service furnished at a fixed monthly charge, including Extended Area Service where applicable.

FOREIGN ATTACHMENT

(K)

Any apparatus or device, not provided or authorized by the Utility, that is attached to or used in connection with telephone equipment and facilities provided by the Utility for the rendering of telephone service.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE (K)

Any exchange other than that in which the subscriber is located. (D)

FOREIGN EXCHANGE DIRECTORY LISTING (K)

A directory listing in the directory of an exchange other than the exchange in which a subscriber is furnished local service. (D)

FOREIGN EXCHANGE SERVICE (K)

Exchange service furnished a subscriber from a central office located in an exchange other than that in which the subscriber's primary telephone is located, or off-premises extension telephone service furnished a subscriber in an exchange other than that in which the subscriber's primary telephone is located.

GRADE OF SERVICE (M)

Refers to the number of parties served on a telephone line. The Company provides only one party service except where dedicated facilities are not available. In such areas, multi-party service is provided on a temporary basis until one party capability is available.

GRANDFATHERED SERVICE (N)

Existing service not available to new customers.

GRANDFATHERED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT (N)

Equipment listing by the FCC in conjunction with FCC Docket No. 19528 which may be connected to access services of the Company.

HARM

(N)(K)

Harm consists of hazards to personnel, damages to Company equipment, and impairment of service to persons other than the user of the customer-provided equipment. Types of harm include, but shall not be limited to, voltages dangerous to personnel, environmental hazard destruction of or damage to equipment, induced noise or cross talk, incorrect dial pulsing, failure of supervision, false answer, incorrect billing, absence of voice bank transmission path for call progress signal, and loss of capability to answer an incoming call.

INDIVIDUAL LINE SERVICE (ONE PARTY SERVICE)

A grade of exchange service furnished by means of a central office line arranged to serve one primary telephone only although additional telephones may be connected to the line as extension telephones.

Only one party service is provided for local access unless dedicated facilities are not available. All multi-party service is automatically upgraded to one party service with thirty days notice to the customer when dedicated facilities are available.

INDUCTIVE COUPLER

A device which makes connection with the telephone line through induction as opposed to direct electrical connection.

INITIAL SERVICE PERIOD

(N)

The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time.

INSTALLATION CHARGE (T)(K)

A non-recurring charge made at the time of installation of communications service.

INTERCOMMUNICATION SYSTEM (N)

An arrangement involving two or more stations which enables a user to signal and connect with other stations in the system.

INTERCONNECTION

See "Connection Arrangement"

INTEREXCHANGE COMMON CARRIER (IXC) (N)

Denotes specialized Common Carriers, Domestic and International Record Carriers and Domestic Satellite Carriers engaged in providing telecommunications services as such carriers may be authorized by the FCC and the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.

INTEREXCHANGE RECEIVING SERVICE

A combination of exchange and toll service whereby a business subscriber in one exchange may arrange to receive calls placed to a special number by the subscribers from another exchange. The subscriber agrees to accept such calls on an operator-handled station toll call basis. The special number is published in the directory of the exchange where the call originates.

INTERFACE (T)(M)

The point of interconnection between terminal equipment and telephone company communications facilities. This point is at the Standard FCC jack furnished by the telephone company. (Also see Network Interface Device).

JOINT USER SERVICE

(T)(K)

An arrangement whereby an individual, firm or corporation, whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the provision of a separate customer service, is permitted to use the service of an existing customer.

KEY TELEPHONE SYSTEM

(N)

A service arrangement consisting of multiline telephone sets equipped with either rotary dial or touch call pads with common equipment.

KEY TELEPHONE SERVICE

A central office line providing service to a key telephone system.

LINE EXTENSION

(T)

The outside plant required in addition to existing facilities to render telephone service.

LOCAL CHANNEL

(N)

That portion of a channel which connects a station to an interexchange channel or a channel connecting two or more stations within an exchange area.

LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE

(T)(K)

Exchange service whereby a customer can complete calls from his station to other stations within the exchange area without the payment of long distance charges and in accordance with the provisions of the Company's tariffs.

LOCAL MESSAGE

(T)

A completed call between stations located within the same local calling area.

LOCAL PRIVATE LINE

A non-switched line located wholly within an exchange, furnished for the subscriber's own use for communication or signaling between points on that line.

LOCAL SERVICE

Telephone service furnished between subscriber's stations located within the same local service area.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA

The area within which telephone service is furnished under a specific schedule of rates.

A service for which charges are based upon the number of originated messages placed by the subscriber to telephones within the same local or message rate calling area.

MESSAGE

A completed telephone call.

MILEAGE

Additional recurring charges based on distance measurements as provided in the schedules.

MINIMUM CONTRACT PERIOD

The minimum length of time for which a customer is obligated is obligated to pay for service, facilities and equipment, whether or not retained by the customer for such minimum length of time. (M) (D)

MODULAR CONNECTING DEVICE (N)

A type of jack and plug arrangement as defined by the FCC.

MULTI-PARTY SERVICE

This service is currently grandfathered for existing customers until one party service is available and only offered to new customers where one party service is not yet available. In either event, all multi-party services are automatically upgraded to one party service with thirty days notice to the customer when dedicated facilities are available. (T)(M) (D) (M)

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALLING (T)(M)

(K)

Denotes the transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision(control, status and charging signals), address signaling, (e.g. dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals (call progress signals indicating reorder or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) (D)
to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING UNIT (T)(K)

The terminal equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Telephone Company for the provision of network control signaling. (D)

NETWORK INTERFACE DEVICE (N)

The Network Interface Device is a standard FCC approved jack which serves as the point of demarcation between those facilities owned by the Company and those facilities which may or may not be owned by the customer in the provision of exchange access, WATS, or Private Line Services. The Network Interface Device may be located inside or outside the customer premises, as determined by the Company, but within close proximity to the protector or equivalent.

NON-CONTIGUOUS EXCHANGES (M)

Two exchanges whose boundaries do not adjoin.

(N)

(K)

The normal working day for installation, repair and construction will be all days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. except Saturdays, Sundays and legal Holidays.

NON-LISTED TELEPHONE NUMBER SERVICE

(T)

The omission of the subscriber's name, address and telephone number, at his request, from the telephone directory, but including the listing in the Utility's "Directory Assistance" listings.

NON-PUBLISHED TELEPHONE NUMBER SERVICE

(T)

The omission of the subscriber's name, address and telephone number, at his request, from both the telephone directory and the Utility's "Directory Assistance" listings.

NON-RECURRING CHARGE

(N)

A one-time charge associated with certain installations, changes or transfers of services either in lieu of or in addition to recurring monthly charges.

OFF-PREMISES EXTENSIONS

(T)

Off-premises extensions are additional appearances of a private branch exchange station line, or an additional appearance of an individual line at a location outside the premises on which is housed the primary telephone located so as to require the installation of an additional Network Interface Device.

ONE-PARTY SERVICE

(D)

A grade of exchange service furnished by means of a central office line arranged to serve one primary telephone only, although additional telephones may be connected to the line as extension telephones. Only one-party service is provided for local access unless dedicated facilities are not available. All multi-party service is automatically upgraded to one party service with thirty days notice to the customer when dedicated facilities are available.

(K)

PARTY LINE SERVICE

A grade of exchange service furnished by means of a central office line arranged to serve more than one primary telephone and with distinctive ringing for each primary telephone on that line.

This service is currently grandfathered for existing customers until one party service is available or only offered to new customers where one party service is not yet available. In either event, all multi-party services are automatically up-graded to one party service with thirty days notice to the customer when dedicated facilities are available.

PERMANENT DISCONNECT

A service is permanently disconnected when the subscriber's service has been totally discontinued.

POINT OF CONNECTION

(N)

The location of a customer premise where facilities, provided by the Company, terminate at which point transmitting or receiving terminal equipment or switching equipment used for communications with terminal equipment on the premises may be connected.

PREMISES

(K)

The buildings, portion or portions of a building on continuous property used and/or occupied at one time by the customer in the conduct of his business or as a residence. Where the roof in adjoining buildings is made continuous and all floor space in both buildings is considered as the same premises insofar as the customer who uses and occupies such continuous floor space is concerned, the two buildings otherwise being considered as separate buildings.

PRIVATE BRANCH EXCHANGE (PBX)

(T)

A communication system provided to a customer and consisting of various stations, equipment and facilities to connect these stations to central office lines or to other stations in the system either manually or automatically.

PRIVATE LINE - See "Local Private Line"

(T)

PUBLIC TELEPHONE SERVICE

A non-listed non-subscriber exchange service telephone installed for the convenience of the public at a location chosen or accepted by the Utility. A coin collecting device is provided for the immediate collection of charges for each outgoing local and toll message.

A program whereby the FCC grants a Registration Number to a particular terminal device which meets particular criteria prescribed by the FCC. Registration may be granted for terminal equipment or protective circuitry. A registration number will appear on all equipment so certified.

REGISTERED PROTECTIVE SECURITY (N)

Separate, identifiable and discrete electrical circuitry designed to protect the telephone network from harm, which is registered in accordance with Part 68 of FCC Rules and Regulations.

RESALE OF SERVICE (N)

An activity wherein one entity subscribes to the communications services and facilities of another entity and then re-offers communications service and facilities to the public(with or without adding value) for profit.

RESERVED TELEPHONE NUMBER (N)

A telephone number reserved for use by the customer at some undetermined future date.

RESIDENCE SERVICE (T)(M)

Telephone service furnished to customer when the actual or obvious use is for domestic purposes.

ROUTE MILEAGE

The distance measured along the route of the circuit between any two or more given points on that circuit.

REMOTE CALL FORWARDING (N)

An arrangement to automatically forward all incoming calls placed to the remote call forwarding number, to another telephone number.

RURAL LINE SERVICE - See "Multi-Party" (M)

SEMI-PUBLIC TELEPHONE SERVICE

(T)(M)

An individual line service, equipped with a coin collecting device, designed for a combination of customer and public use at locations more or less public in character. Semi-public telephone service is considered as a form of local exchange service.

SERVICE CONNECTION CHARGE

(T)

The nonrecurring charges intended to cover, in part, the expense incurred by the Company for work performed at the customer's request associated with a Service Order, Central Office Work and Line Connections.

SERVICE POINT

When used in connection with customer-provided communications system, a service point denotes the point on the subscriber's premises where channels provided by or furnished to the subscriber by the Utility are terminated.

SPECULATIVE PROJECT

An undertaking of a speculative nature which, in the opinion of the Utility, involves risk of failure.

SUBSCRIBER (T)(M)

SUPERSEDURE (T)

A supersedure of a service means the transfer of toll service, including the telephone number from one party to another. This arrangement requires continuous billing with no change in the type or location of equipment.

TARIFF (T)

A schedule of recurring and nonrecurring charges, together with general regulations, properly filed and approved by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, applicable to the customers of the Company for services furnished.

A service including both exchange, toll service, or private line.

TELEPHONE STATION SET (N)

TELETYPEWRITER (N)

A teletypewriter consists of apparatus designed for the sending and receiving, or receiving only, of typewritten messages transmitted electrically.

TEMPORARY DISCONNECT

The suspension of telephone service at the request of the subscriber or on the initiative of the Utility without permanent discontinuance of service.

TERMINAL EQUIPMENT (N)

Customer-provided devices utilized for transmission or reception of communications when attached to the telecommunications network facilities at a point on the customer's side of the station protector, network interface or other point of demarcation. And includes, but not limited to telephone station sets, speaker phones, answering devices, dialers, data sets, computer terminals, paging systems, alarm systems, key systems, PBX's, etc.

TERMINAL LOOP (C)(M)

The wire facility used in providing an off-premises access line.

TERMINATION CHARGE (T)

A charge made to a customer upon termination of contract for service before the expiration of the contract period.

TIE LINE (T)

A circuit connecting two PBX systems for the purpose of intercommunication between the stations connected with such PBX switching apparatus. (M)

TOLL ACCESS LINE (T)(M)

A circuit used exclusively for the transmission of messages between points located in different exchange areas where specific charges for each such message are applicable.

TOLL CENTER (N)

A telephone switching center at which the operations function(message timing, switching and recording) takes place in connection with the provision of toll message service.

TOLL MESSAGE (T)

1. Person-to-Person Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication with a specified person or station at a specified location.
2. Station-to-Station Toll Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates a desire for communication only with a specified telephone number or switchboard.
3. Collect Message: A toll message in which the user stipulates that the called party accept and pay all charges associated with the message.
4. Third Number Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed neither to the calling station nor to the called station but rather to a station not involved in the message.
5. Credit Card Message: A toll message in which associated charges are billed to a credit card number assigned by a telephone company and issued to either the called or calling party.

DEFINITIONS (CONTINUED)

TOLL RATE (T)(M)

The initial period charge prescribed for a toll message usually based upon a minimum initial period and distance between exchanges.

TOLL SERVICE (T)

Toll service (long distance service) is that part of the total telephone service rendered by the Company which is furnished between customer and different exchange areas in accordance with the rates and regulations specified in the Company's Toll Tariff.

TOLL STATION (N)

A telephone instrument connected for toll service only to which message telephone toll rates apply for each call made therefrom.

TOUCH CALLING SERVICE (T)

A service arrangement permitting the use of telephone instruments equipped with keys/buttons, each of which generates a dual frequency tone, for the origination of calls. Touch Calling Service is provided free of charge with local access service (e.g. R-1, B-1).

TOUCH DIALING - See "Touch Calling Service"

TOUCH TONE TELEPHONE - See "Touch Calling Service" (M)

DEFINITIONS (CONTINUED)

TRADE NAME (M)

The name or style under which a concern conducts its business and by which it is generally known to the public.

TRENCHING COSTS (N)

Cost of excavating, backfilling and compacting and where necessary, cost of breaking and replacing pavement and of restoring landscaping.

TRUNK LINE

An "Access Line Arrangement" providing service for a PBX or PABX; or for a telephone circuit between two Central Offices.

TYPE OF SERVICE

Refers to flat rate service; message rate(measured) service, and public or semi-public service.

UNDERGROUND SERVICE CONNECTION (N)

A customer's "drop" wire which is run underground from a pole line or an underground distributing cable.

UNATTENDED STATION APPARATUS (T)

Station apparatus that automatically creates an off-hook condition at a called station to enable customer provided equipment to transmit signals when such station is called. The apparatus restores an off-hook condition after the call is completed.
